
# **Clothing House Blessings Number 1, Rhea Lana!**

We were blessed to partner with Rhea Lana, a consignment shop company that does baby and toddler up to young adult clothing, to receive the remaining items that did not sell at their trunk show in March! Our board member, Peggy Clark, spearheads this endeavor to stock out baby and toddler room with the clothes we pass out 3 times a week at our clothing house. We gained 50-60 trash bags full of all sizes baby ad toddler clothing and shoes and even some books! We were able to coordinate a bevy of volunteers to work a full week on taking hangers off items, removing safety pins and tags and sizing all the donations we received. With the assistance of Ann Taylor who works in the baby and toddler room and is the wife of our board member, Jim Taylor, we were able to get a full house of volunteers inside the sorting area manning 5 large tables from 9 AM – 3 PM all week! The Winchester Star had printed a story about the family of Katie Teets Bradshaw trying to build a tribute to the life of their daughter, sister, and wife. Katie was a 28-year-old oncology nurse who had breast cancer and lost her battle with the disease. But Katie was not a loser, and she enjoyed her time long enough to be married just 3 weeks before she passed away. The loss of Katie inspired her family to build a Comfort House which would help so many other families. After reading the article about how the Teets family is baking and selling cinnamon rolls as a way they could raise funds, we contacted the family to ask if there was any possible way that CCAP could lend a hand and help by using the new CCAP box van. They were thrilled about our offer and replied immediately that we could help by loading several thousand cinnamon rolls into the CCAP van the next weekend. Two CCAP volunteer drivers went to the Teets' residence and took the homemade sweet treats to a distribution point at Claudio's Pizza on Valley Avenue to sell on Sunday, February 13. We felt this was a perfect way to utilize the gift to CCAP from the Winchester community through the Chain of Checks. Thank you to the Winchester community to allow us to help so many in so many ways.



# **Community Outreach to CCAP from FOOD PRO!**

## CCAP got a blessing!

We were struggling with quantities of proteins for our clients, so we reached out to FOOD PRO, a local food distributor that had donated many items in the past to see if they had any proteins to purchase. Unknowingly, our internal contact at FOOD PRO, Billie Jo Howett, went to social media and shared CCAP's struggle and within 30 minutes she had raised \$1,000 toward the purchase of proteins for CCAP. She offered to go purchase the proteins by bulk at a great cost and prepare packaging to freeze in their consumer commercial kitchen as we are unable to do so here. We received hamburger, hot dogs, bacon, sausage, chicken and more!
