Aetna was able to share plans with the community & medical coverage which was a big surprise to those affected. Molina Healthcare comes monthly and does a Baby Shower with diaper giveaways and info. Multiple banks come to share options to assist with loans or account setups and how to manage money. Laurel Ridge was a wonderful sharing session on adult education.















Mission - Orphanage

Agnes Blankson, a resident of Manassas, VA and her family have been helping the orphanage for several years by getting children's clothing at low or no cost and shipping it twice a year to the orphanage in Ghana, West Africa. Agnes was searching online one day and came across this orphanage and noticed the need and wanted to assist them. She started searching for low cost clothing to ship to Ghana and happened to come to CCAP clothing giveaway last year. She shared her story with us that day and CCAP has offered for her need ever since. The name is Sankofa mmofra fie Ophanage and School in the village of Eguafo, near Elmina. CCAP has been able to help Agnes' family in their ministry by giving excess clothing and off-season clothing that will be shipped to the orphanage in time for Christmas.

Our current donation was only small baby clothing, but previously we sent excess identical sweatshirts in various sizes. The picture was taken of the children outfitted in those sweatshirts and looking very happy!
